Dear Carla and Daniel Jr. Horbich and Survivors:

As you are aware, a Notice of Violation of the North Haven Blight Prevention Ordinance was issued against your property at 154 Warner Road, North Haven ("Property") on January 11, 2017 and you have not yet remedied all of the blight conditions at the Property as cited in the Notice of Violation.

Therefore, the property has been included in the Notice of Meeting for the next Meeting of the Blight Prevention Appeals Board, which is **Tuesday, August 18, 2020 at 7:00 P.M.** so that the Blight Prevention Officer may provide a status update to the Board at that time. **As indicated in the enclosed Notice of Meeting, the Board's August 18th Meeting will be held via ZOOM videoconference and conference call.**



to grow their businesses and the amount of extraordinary people I meet. I love hearing their stories, how they came to do what they do, and being able to help them grow."

She found a way to share those stories after a Shoreline East BNI member showed her the local magazines he had created for the community and suggested she do the same in North Haven. She decided to give it a try, founding *North Haven Neighbors* magazine. She ran it for two years before Chris Migliaro took over.

The monthly magazine shared news from local businesses as well as the accomplishments of local students. "It seemed like a fun thing to do," says Jackie. "I loved the part that helped businesses get the word out about them and talking to people, finding out what they do, but you had to sell the ads and after two years that got to me."

While she is no longer involved in the magazine, she still is active on the North Haven Neighbors Facebook page. She also created the North Haven Buzz community page on Facebook, which has more than 1,000 members. "North Haven Buzz is a way for me to still write and call attention

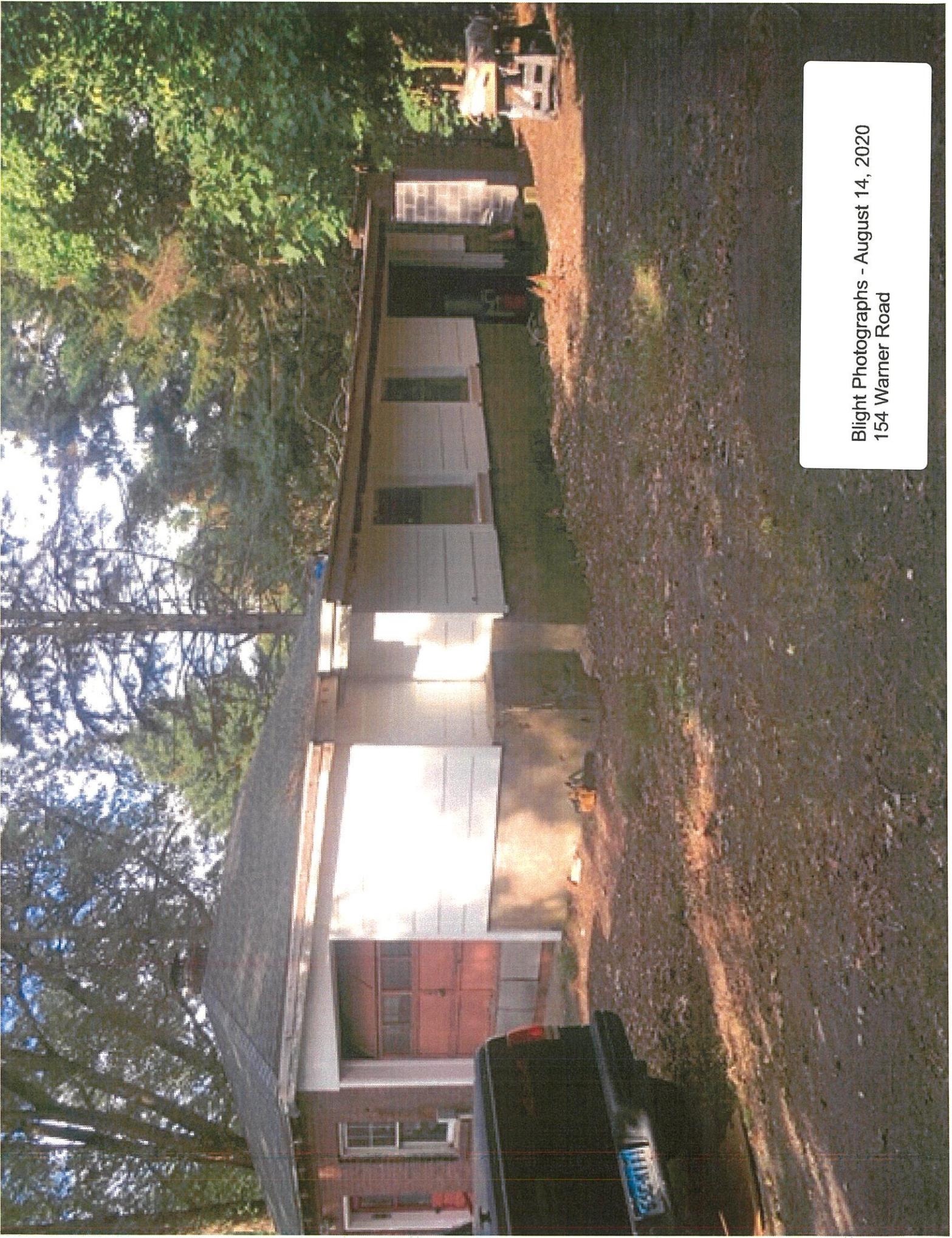
to the great things going on in town and help the community and businesses come together help each other," says Jackie. She came out of wanting to give people a place to ask questions, get recommendations, help the people in town, and give them an outlet to vent or get answers."

She found that the page especially important during the COVID-19 pandemic as many businesses were struggling. COVID-19 pandemic also allowed Jackie and her partner, Kir Olszewski, at Carbutti & Company to develop Carbutti Care

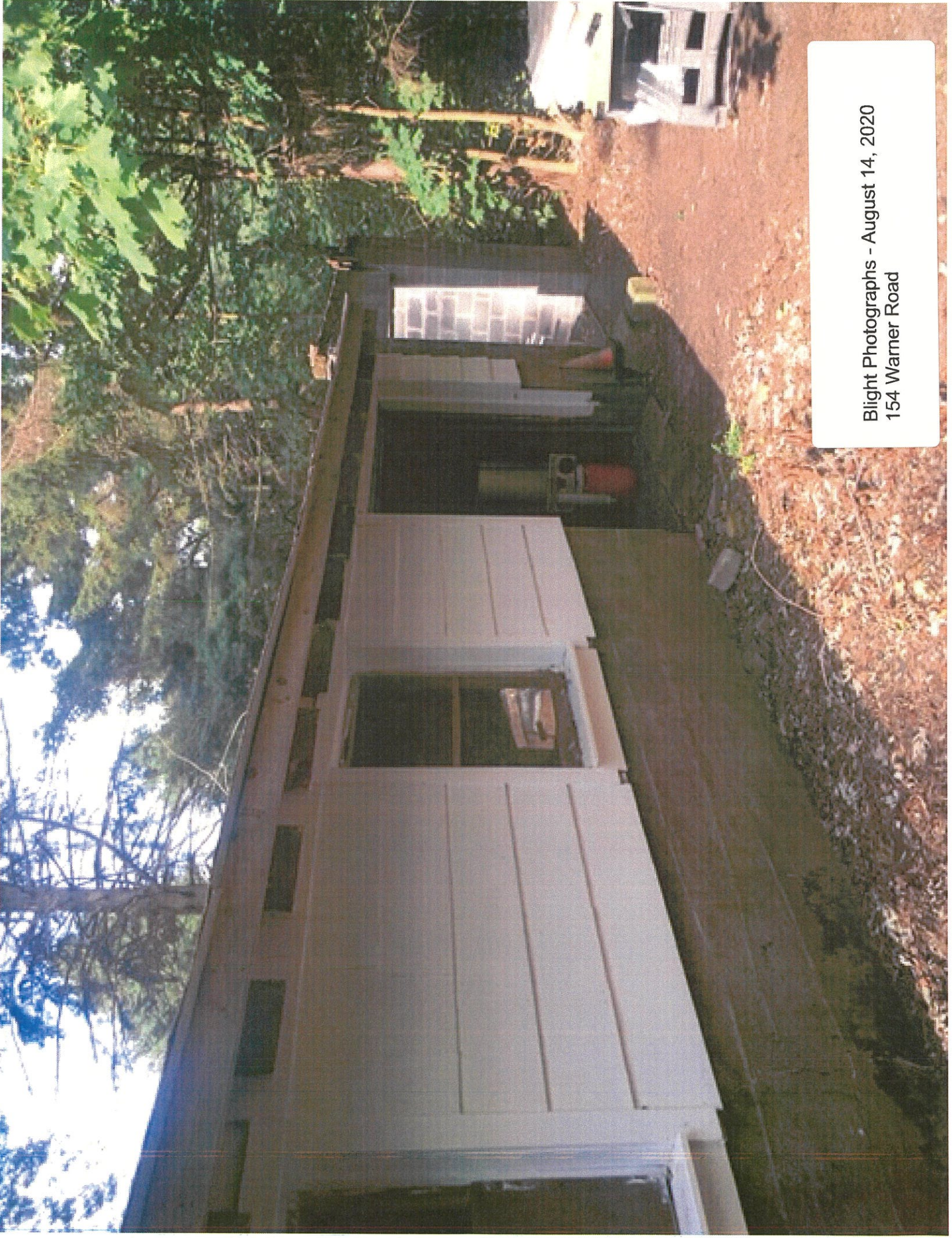

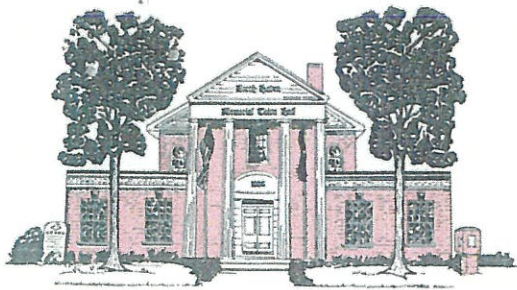

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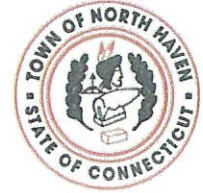

Re: **NOTICE OF VIOLATION OF BLIGHT PREVENTION ORDINANCE**
154 Warner Road, North Haven, Connecticut

Dear Carla and Daniel Jr. Horbich and Survivors;

On January 6, 2017, and in my capacity as the Town of North Haven's Blight Prevention Officer, I received a complaint regarding the existence of possible violation(s) of Chapter 84 of the Ordinances, Town of North Haven, the Blight Prevention Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the "Ordinance"), at the property of 154 Warner Road in North Haven, Connecticut.

Specifically, the Complainant has alleged that the property:

- Overall is blighted; and
- Please look into the matter.

Section 84-3 of the Ordinance, entitled "Prohibition Against Blighted Premises" states "No owner of real property located in the Town of North Haven shall allow, create, maintain or cause to be created or maintained, a blighted premises." "Blighted premises" is defined as, "Real property, including any building or structure located thereon, which is and continues to be in the state of disrepair or is becoming dilapidated ..." The terms "state of disrepair" or "becoming dilapidated" are therein defined in the Ordinance under Section 84-2.

I have conducted an investigation of the allegations of the complaint and have determined that a violation of the Ordinance exists at 154 Warner Road as I observed the following conditions at said property which evidence the violation, including:

- There is siding and trim on the home, which is in a state of disrepair and/or is damaged and

- needs paint and /or repairs;
- There are shutters on the home, which are in a state of disrepair and/or are damaged and need paint and /or repairs;
- There is overgrown brush, grass, and/or weeds in excess of one foot in height, which needs to be addressed; and
- The property is unsightly, unkempt and a nuisance to the general public.

Pursuant to Section 84-4 of the Ordinance, you as the property owner(s) of 154 Warner Road must remedy the listed conditions which constitute a violation of the Ordinance within thirty (30) days of the date of this NOTICE OF VIOLATION or such longer period as I may permit in my discretion as the Blight Prevention officer. Please contact me immediately if you believe that there are circumstances, which exist that warrant exercise of that discretion.

Please take note that, as the property owner of 154 Warner Road, you may contest the NOTICE OF VIOLATION and liability for same before the Town of North Haven's Blight Prevention Board of Appeals by delivering in person or by mail, written notice of your request to do so, to me as the Blight Prevention Officer within ten (10) calendar days of this NOTICE OF VIOLATION.

IF YOU FAIL TO REMEDY THE VIOLATIONS OF THE ORDINANCE NOTED HEREIN WITHIN THIRTY (30) CALENDAR DAYS AND YOU DO NOT DEMAND A HEARING BEFORE THE BLIGHT PREVENTION APPEALS BOARD WITHIN TEN (10) CALENDAR DAYS HEREOF, THE BOARD SHALL ISSUE A CITATION AND ASSESSMENT OF FINES AND DELIVER NOTICE OF SAME TO YOU. A VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF \$100.00 A DAY FOR EACH DAY A VIOLATION CONTINUES TO EXIST. THE DATE THE CITATION IS ISSUED BY THE BLIGHT PREVENTION APPEALS BOARD SHALL BE THE COMMENCEMENT DATE FOR SAID FINE. YOUR FAILURE TO PAY THE ASSESSMENT OF ANY FINE(S) BY THE BLIGHT PREVENTION APPEALS BOARD MAY RESULT IN THE ENTRY OF A JUDGMENT BY THE SUPERIOR COURT AND THE LEVY OF AN EXECUTION ON THE JUDGMENT WITHOUT FURTHER NOTICE.

Please contact me immediately at (203) 239-5321, extension 440 to discuss the NOTICE OF VIOLATION and your proposed remedy of same. My office is located at the Town Hall Annex, 5 Linsley Street, North Haven and we are open to the public from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.
